## CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

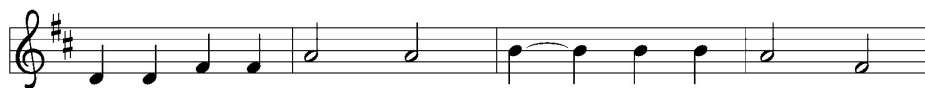
By faith in Jesus Christ,
