⁸ Do not be ashamed, then, of the testimony about our Lord or of me his prisoner, but join with me in suffering for the gospel, in the power of God, ⁹ who saved us and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works but according to his own purpose and grace, and this grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, ¹⁰ but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. ¹¹ For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, ¹² and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day the deposit I have entrusted to him. ¹³ Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴ Guard the good deposit entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.







Have you ever wondered what people mean when they say, “The Bible says so”? Scripture doesn’t always speak with one clear voice, so how do we faithfully understand what the Bible is—and isn’t—saying?

This year, I invite you to join a congregational book study on *The Bible Says So*, by Dan McClellan. McClellan, a biblical scholar, helps readers explore how the Bible came to be, how it has been interpreted, and how we might approach it with more understanding. His writing invites us to think deeply, ask questions, and discover new ways of engaging with God’s Word.

Dan seeks to understand the data of the Bible over the dogma of faith. So often today our narrative of the Bible carries more weight than what is actually in the Bible. The book asks questions like: Does the Bible say slavery is wrong? Does the Bible say abortion is murder? Does the Bible say Satan is God’s enemy? Does the Bible say Jesus is God? Does the Bible say sinners will be punished forever in Hell?

Whether you are new to the Bible or have read Scripture your whole life, this book offers a chance to grow in faith and in community. Bring your questions, your curiosity, and your openness as we seek to listen for God’s voice through the pages of Scripture.
