





Pastor Rachel S. Larson most recently served for twelve years as Chaplain to the College at Gustavus Adolphus College in Saint Peter, MN. She provided leadership in preaching, liturgy planning, pastoral care, small group ministry and strategic planning. She collaborated with students, staff, faculty and administration in numerous programs and college-wide initiatives.

Pastor Larson is a graduate of Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN and Augustana College in Sioux Falls, SD. Before becoming a pastor she was a registered nurse in Minneapolis, MN. She also served as pastor at Hosanna Lutheran Church in Houston, Texas; Lutheran Campus Ministry at Penn State University; Hospice San Antonio in Kerrville, Texas; and St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Marble Falls, Texas.

Pastor Larson is also a retreat leader, labyrinth facilitator, and has introduced countless people to spiritual practices such as meditation, centering prayer, movement, lectio divina and chant. She is fascinated with biblical study and feminist theology. Embracing a liturgical spirituality that affirms and renews the whole self – body, mind and spirit – is a key focus of her life and ministry. A theology and practice of creation care is another passion of hers.

Joining Pastor Larson is her husband, Don P. Holmstrom, who is also a Lutheran pastor and writer. Their daughter, Susanna, lives in Bellingham, WA.

Dr. Steven Hoffman serves as Kantor at King of Glory Lutheran Church, Cheyenne and at St. Andrew's Lutheran Church and Campus Center, Laramie. He teaches Organ and Counterpoint in the music department at University of Wyoming.

Dr. Hoffman received the Bachelor of Music in Organ and Choral Music at the Lawrence Conservatory of Music, Appleton, Wisconsin. He received the Master of Music in Organ at the University of South Dakota, Vermillion, South Dakota. He attained the Doctor of Musical Arts in Organ and Sacred Music at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor.

Bishop Jim Gonia was elected to a six-year term on April 28, 2013, at the Rocky Mountain Synod's annual assembly in Colorado Springs, Colo. He was installed on September 23, 2013.


He served as a missionary in Madagascar from 1988 to 1998. From 1998 to 2009 he was called as the associate pastor of Atonement Lutheran Church in Denver.
