1st Sunday in Advent:

Advent is about the "coming days." God's people have always lived in great expectation, but that expectation finds specific, repeated enunciation in the texts appointed for these four weeks. The ancients anticipated a "righteous Branch to spring up for David." The Thessalonians awaited "the coming of our Lord Jesus with all the saints." Our Lord's contemporaries hoped for the time "to stand before the Son of Man." With them we eagerly await the coming days: another Christmas celebration, a second coming, and the advent of our Lord in word and supper.

A WORD ABOUT THE GOSPEL TODAY

Stand and Raise Your Heads

In classrooms all over the world, students are taught to raise their hands if they have something to say. This is an orderly way to let their teachers know that they are ready to ask or answer a question. Raised hands show that we have been paying attention and are prepared to participate in the classroom discussion.

If raising your hand signals your readiness to speak, imagine what Jesus has in mind when he calls us to stand up and raise our heads. In the midst of distressing signs of upheaval and conflict in the heavens, the oceans, and among the nations, Jesus says: stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near (Luke 21:28).

The Advent season invites us to begin a new church year by creating our own signs—not signs of upheaval and distress, but rather signs and symbols and songs of hope and anticipation of the coming of the Lord. The world always seems full of turmoil and unexpected change, and Jesus wants us to know more than what the headlines tell us is going on. In the midst of the world's fears and uncertainties, Jesus stirs the power of our faith so that we can recognize how he is coming to be with us.

Advent is our signal to one another that Jesus is near. Advent is our great reminder to prepare to meet him. Advent turns us inward as a community set apart to celebrate his coming, and Advent also turns us outward to care for the world he promises to redeem, restore, and renew. As we embrace this wonderful season, we will learn more and more about the amazing things God has promised to do in our hearts, in our congregations, and in our world. Stand up and raise your heads. You have something to say.


COMMEMORATIONS THIS WEEK

Clement—Monday, November 23, 2015

Clement was the third bishop of Rome. He is best remembered for a letter he wrote to the congregation in Corinth, still struggling with the same problems that led to Paul's letters to them. As did Paul, he focused on the need for love among Christians.

Isaac Watts—Wednesday, November 25, 2015

Thought by many to be the greatest hymn writer in the English language, Watts as a youth was critical of the quality of the metrical psalter of the time. He wrote about 600 hymns—many based on the psalms, but others that are not.

FIRST READING: Jeremiah 33:14-16
