Grace Among Us

Grace. Truth. Gospel. The words we hear in worship week after week point to a powerful reality beyond the world we see before us. At the same time, these powerful words can start to lose their meaning precisely because we can't see or touch the reality to which they point.

As we enter into a new year, we continue to reflect upon the birth of Jesus—the Word made flesh. In Jesus, things like grace and truth are never hazy, spiritual-sounding ideas. In Jesus, fully God and fully human, we encounter grace with skin and truth with a heartbeat. And in Jesus, we receive "power to become children of God" (John 1:12), not because we always have certainty in our understanding of God, but because of who Jesus is.

This might seem like small comfort. After all, we're not likely to run into Jesus in person when we're walking down the street or at the coffee shop. And yet, we can still encounter grace with skin and truth with a heartbeat in the people who surround us every day, and also when we gather together with the body of believers to confess our faith and share in the hope of the gospel. We can encounter the Word made flesh in the hand we shake as we share the peace, the taste and texture of holy communion on our tongues, or the voices that come together to sing about the one from whom we have all received "grace upon grace" (1:16).

The Gospel of John tells us that Jesus is "close to the Father's heart" (1:18). Through Jesus, the Word made flesh, we are brought close to the Father's heart, called to be grace with skin and truth with a heartbeat to the world in which we live.


