Home Is Where We Are

Just before his death, Jesus talks to his disciples about *home*. We all long for it: a place called home. As children we may have experienced home as the place we belonged and were accepted. Or we may first have experienced home when we started making our own home, away from our family of origin. At many times in life it can feel like we are far away from home. If only we could click our ruby-slippered feet three times and say, "There's no place like home," and then magically be transported there!

The disciples are gathered with Jesus for a final evening meal. They are starting to feel their feathers getting ruffled and are scared to stretch their wings. Jesus was home for them. He gave them a kind of belonging that felt like home. There was a powerful, divine acceptance in him that had changed them and given them peace. But Jesus was talking about going away, and it felt like being kicked out of the nest.

Then Jesus promises them: Wherever I am, you will be. And wherever you are, I abide with you and God abides with me. You are always home because God is always with you through me. Home is wherever you are because I am wherever you are.

Home is who you are with and belong to, where you are more than where you were. We belong to God through Jesus in the Spirit. This is the gift of baptism, the gift of belonging. Wherever we are, we are home because God is with us as gracious and loving presence.

If you've ever felt like you have no place to belong, welcome home. Eat supper, rest, and be at peace. In Christ, you are home, and there's no place like it.

COMMEMORATIONS FOR THE WEEK

Sunday, May 18, 2014 - Erik, King of Sweden, martyr, died 1160

Erik is considered the patron saint of Sweden. As king of that nation, he tried to bring peace in the region, and to spread Christianity in Scandinavia. He was also known for his attempts to make fair laws and to protect those who were poor or sick.


Wednesday, May 21 - Helena, mother of Constantine, died 330

Influenced by her son to become Christian, Helena (or Helen) lived an exemplary life of faith. She is also remembered for traveling through Palestine building churches on the sites she believed to be associated with Christ's life.

Nicolaus Copernicus, died 1543; Leonhard Euler, died 1783; scientists

These two men were both scientists who helped to explain the wonders of God's universe. Copernicus is best known for promoting the idea that the sun, not the earth, is at the center of our solar system. Euler was one of the founders of pure mathematics, and contributed to many other fields.
