

*GOSPEL: Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23

Glory to you, O Lord.

In Matthew's gospel, both Jesus and his disciples "sow the seed" of God's word by proclaiming the good news that "the kingdom of heaven is near." Now, in a memorable parable, Jesus explains why this good news produces different results in those who hear.

That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. ²Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. ³And he told them many things in parables, saying: "Listen! A sower went out to sow. ⁴And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. ⁵Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. ⁶But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. ⁷Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. ⁸Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some cinty, some thirty. ⁹Let anyone with ears listen!"

¹⁸Hear then the parable of the sower. ¹⁹When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what is sown in the heart; this is what was sown on the path. ²⁰As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; ²¹yet such a person has no root, but endures only for a while, and when trouble or persecution arises on account of the word, that person immediately falls away. ²²As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the lure of wealth choke the word, and it yields nothing. ²³But as for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields, in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty."





Good Soil

Just like a seed needs good soil to grow, the "word of the kingdom" (Matt. 13:19) also requires certain conditions in order to do its work among God's people: understanding, perseverance in hardship, and strength in temptation.

That is why we *gather* in community to hear the word proclaimed. Reading the Bible on our own is a fine and important discipline for deepening our relationship with God, but it is not enough. On our own, we might misunderstand the word. But through the preaching, witness, and guidance of our sisters and brothers we see the words of scripture in a fuller light, a light that breaks in through the many shades and perspectives of their lives as sunbeams through stained glass. The full beauty and power of God's word comes out in the community's reflection and leaves us transformed.

Also, by ourselves we might not have enough strength to keep God's word in the face of daily challenges. Can we really stand up for justice even if this makes us unpopular? Can we make room in our budget for generosity when advertisings everywhere invite us to spend our money only on ourselves? Can we stay grounded and humble in the face of success? Can we be bold witnesses for the gospel or will we shrink away from the challenge? Maybe we cannot do it perfectly right now, but certainly we are able to more and more every day.

After all, we are following in the footsteps of the Christ who has gone before us in the flesh and taken up all hardships on the cross. This is the one who promises later in this gospel that "where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them" (Matt. 18:20). So when we gather with others around word and sacrament, Christ's presence in his body turns our hard and barren hearts into good soil.

A native of Spain, Las Casas first came to the Western hemisphere while serving in the military. Granted a large estate with indigenous slaves, he freed them after he was ordained a priest. He worked in the Caribbean and Central America to improve the lives of the native peoples.
