2 Me Our Mission Our Hope Trinity Lutheran

Over the last years we have witnessed a cultural disengagement from community, one exacerbated by politics and a pandemic: trauma specialists have shared that trauma pushes people to self-isolate and leave community events. Congregation members have disengaged from community worship and community faith at Trinity. Those who are disengaged have become so for many reasons. For some it was Covid, for others it was hard to hear polarizing opinions on masks and vaccines, for others it was a needed break from the increased demands of society.

This fall, Trinity is engaging in a campaign called ME2WE, a campaign beginning with the singular and moving to the plural. Trinity Lutheran does not exist to serve only individuals: we exist to create community in Christ. Seminarians say, "the whole is greater than the sum of its parts," meaning that the community has a larger impact than all the individuals that participate. Our congregation's effectiveness is greater as a community than when acting in isolation from one another.

Someone at Trinity needs your perspective on grace and faith.

Congregations don't flourish if it's an individual transaction. We do life together and we do faith together. If you have been taking a sabbatical from community to heal, please join us again.




